In the first place I call to remembrance the 29th day
 of May in the year of our Lord Christ 1616 in the year seven hundred and seventy
 late Edward Talbot of Killinches in the County of Limerick
 Esquire of Killinches being deceased President of perfect
 Mind memory and body having for which I praise God for his great mer-
 cies toward me And calling to mind the Mortality of this my Body &
 knowing that it is appointed for men once to Die and after that to
 Appear in Judgment; I make & renew this my last Will & Testament
 in Manner following first of all I recommend my soul to God hoping
 for the pardon of my sins for the sake of Christ in whom alone there
 is Redemption and Righteousness according to the riches of his grace; And
 my Body to the Earth to be therein buried in a decent manner at the
 Discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting but I shall receive the
 same again by the Right of Power of God; And so Touching such goods
 as I have wherewithal I have placed God to bless me in this life I do here
 by order and dispose thereof in the following Manner and form I will
 and ordain that my just debts & funeral charges be fully & duly paid &
 discharged & if I have any well beloved wife living
 after my death her to be provided for & maintained during her natural life
 and after her Death I will & ordain that my daughter Mary the wife of John Baileys
 Esq; be provided for & supported to the best of my power & choice
 during her Natural life; And after the Death of my wife I will & ordain
 that she and her estate unto my Daughter Mary the wife of John Baileys
 have and bequeath unto my said wife a sufficient Maintenance out of the
 profits of my Real Estate during her Natural life in the manner hereinabove
 prescribed. Item give and bequeath all the residue of my Personal Estate (not
 herein before bequeathed) unto my said Daughter Mary the wife of John Baileys
 to my said Daughter Mary all that tract & plantation of land that I

in my State wherewithal I have thought fit to dispose of this life. I do her
by order and dispose thereof with the following Manner and from thence will
and ordaineth that my just debts & several Charges be fully & duly paid &
defracted. And I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Mary,
eldest my best & dearest Friend & Companion my dwelling house called
Crown at 170 Newgate Street London to have & to hold by her during
her life & thereafter to her heirs & assigns to be enjoyed by my said wife in full quiet Possession
during Her Natural Life, and after her decease of my wife Mary in
this house unto my Daughter Mary the wife of John Brice of Lichfield
Esqre and bequeath unto my said wife sufficient Maintenance Out of the
Profits of my Real Estate during Her Natural Life in the manner hereinafter
prescribed. And I give and bequeath all the余物 of my Personal Estate (not
hereint bequeathed) unto my sd Daughter Mary Her Husband John Brice and
to my said Daughter Mary all that tract & plantation of ground that
she may live on containing about Seventy five Acres more or less with the
Buildings and improvements thereto belonging to hold unto her my

my said wife shall have an equal convenience in all the rooms of my said

winter and summer use in a stable, and I do order and Direct that my
said Daughter Mary shall have a place to lay up my said wife sufficient
time over
