Bucks^s: I do Rememb^r that On the 5th Day of Nov^r
1758 this Last Will & Testament of John Eaton was duly prove^d
According to Law & Probate Letters Testamentary were Gra^{nted}
unto Martha Eaton Executrix in the sd. Will named she being
Solemnly Sworn well and Faithfully to Administer the Goods &
Rights and Credits of the said Deceased and to Exhibit a true &
Inventory thereof into the Registrars Office for the said County.

The Twentieth Day of September in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty three I John Eaton of Warminster in the County of Bucks in the Province of Pennsylvania Yeoman Being sick and weak in Body but of Sound and disposing Memory and Understanding Do make this my Last Will and Testament First and Principally I Recommend my Soul to God that gave it And my Body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executrix Nothing Doubting but that I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God And as Touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me I Give and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Impr:

I Will that my funeral Expences and Last Debts be all duly Discharged and paid by my Executrix out of my Personal Estate

Item

I Give unto my Eldest Son Joseph Eaton the Sum of Fifty Shillings Money of Pennsylvania to be paid wheresoever he shall come to Demand the same

Item

I Give and Bequeath all the rest residue and Remainder of my Personal Estate unto my Beloved Wife Martha Eaton And I do also Give unto my said Wife Martha that Messuage Plantation and Land thereunto belonging where I now dwell situate in Warminster aforesaid to be by her freely enjoyed and possessed during the Term of her natural Life

Item

I Give and Bequeath the said Messuage Plantation and Tract of Land supposed to contain about Sixty Acres be the same more or less with the Appurtenances Immediately after the Decease of my said Wife Martha to my three Sons viz John Eaton David Eaton and Edward Eaton Equally between them I share and I share alike to them their Heirs and Assigns for ever

Lastly

I Do Nominate Constitute and Appoint my said Beloved Wife Martha Eaton my true Lawful and Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament and I do hereby Revoke Disallow and Disannul all and every other and former Wills Legacies Bequests and Executors by me heretofore made willed or bequeathed Testifying and Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal the Day and Year first above written
